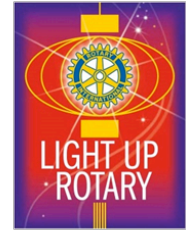

Bets Anderson introduced the program: Andrew Gustafson, The Bryan Museum.

The museum is located at 1315 21st Street. It is the site of the former Galveston Orphans Home. Houston businessman, J.P. Bryan purchased the building in October 2013. The building is significant in part because no one was injured or died there during the 1900 Storm. Galveston contractor, Alex Gonzalez, has been restoring the building. A highlight is the geothermal system used to cool and heat it.

The museum will house Bryan's personal collection of more than 70,000 items representing the history of the southwest. Items include sketches, paintings, spurs and saddles, guns, swords and books. Bryan has been collecting historic items since 1996. The Bryan Museum is scheduled to open in June
