

Dr. Brownlee grew up in Cypress and spent most of his life there. He attended Texas A&M and played in the band. He contemplated going to medical school, but after talking to a doctor about it, he realized that wasn't the direction he wanted to go. He shadowed an optometrist in Crockett and the idea of being a business owner and physician appealed to him. He attended optometry school and graduated in the top 5% of his class. Kevin Katz called him and asked him to join his practice at TSO. He has been in Galveston for eight months and really likes living here.

Marshall Clavin grew up in St Louis, Missouri. His family was secular Jewish. He attended religious school until he was kicked out. A rebel, he traveled to Israel as a teenager to study. He learned that as a Jew, he belonged to a super human family. They have been exiled from their homeland twice and are still around today. He became proud to be Jewish. He was

in Israel when Yitzak Rabin was assassinated in 1995 and considered himself a witness to history. He returned from trip as a different person. He got involved in leadership roles. He returned to Israel. He wanted to help others find their own foundation for the world. He spent six years in rabbinical school, three years as an Air Force chaplain and traveled around the country for another five years. Jimmy Kessler called him and asked him to consider Galveston and he did.
