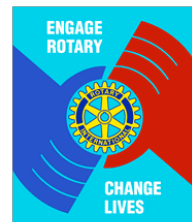

Galveston Lyceum was founded in 1840. Its motto is knowledge is power. Lyceums were established to house debates and other events. In 1852, the Lutherans held the first worship service on Easter Sunday. The Lutheran Church in Galveston purchased the church in 1855 and moved it to its present location

Though the 1900 storm damaged the church, the Lyceum remained in tact. Its cypress construction went unscathed and the Lyceum became a place of shelter for many people.

Today, the Lyceum is a location for pre- or post-nuptial activities, meetings, trade shows and social events for up to 200 people. Cynthia McEldowney coordinates the events. For more information, visit lyceumgalveston.com.
